

Understanding SR&ED Tax Incentives

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What is SR&ED?

Scientific Research and Experimental Development (SR&ED) is a Canadian tax incentive program designed to encourage businesses to conduct research and development in Canada.

Key Eligibility Requirements

- Work must be conducted in Canada.
- Work must aim for scientific or technological advancement.
- Work must involve systematic investigation or search.

Types of Elegible Work

- Basic Research
- Applied Research
- Experimental Development
- Support Work (in specific categories)

The "WHY" Requirement

Work must be conducted to advance scientific knowledge or achieve technological advancement by generating new knowledge.

Key Indicator: Presence of scientific or technological uncertainty at the project's start.

The "HOW" Requirement

Work must follow a systematic investigation or search, including:

- Defining a problem
- Formulating a hypothesis
- Testing through experiment or analysis
- Developing logical conclusions

Examples of Eligible Work

- Basic Research: Studying a newly discovered virus to understand its characteristics.
- **Applied Research:** Developing a vaccine by exploiting characteristics of a new virus.
- Experimental Development: Scaling up and optimizing processes for large-scale vaccine production.

What's Not Eligible

- Market research or sales promotion.
- Quality control or routine testing.
- Research in social sciences or humanities.
- Commercial production or use of new/improved products/processes.
- Style changes.
- Routine data collection.

Key Points to Remember

- → Success is not required for eligibility.
- Work must generate new scientific or technological knowledge.

Overcoming uncertainty is the core of SR&ED work

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How to Assess Your Eligibility?

Ask Yourself

1 Are you facing scientific or technological uncertainties?

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- 2 Are you attempting to overcome these uncertainties through systematic investigation?
- Is your work generating new scientific or technological knowledge?

If you answered "yes" to these questions, your work might qualify for SR&ED tax incentives.
